The Sefton Young Carers Service will be available to talk to families with children who have a direct caring role at home, as well as providing information to social care and teaching professionals who would like to find out more about identifying and supporting young carers.

Other organisations that provide support to carers in Sefton will also be available to speak to at the event including Sefton Advocacy, Alzheimer's Society, Living Well Sefton and The May Logan Centre, as well as information and free guides from the Stroke Association and Macmillan Cancer Support.

Volunteers from the centre will be providing information on current volunteering opportunities including roles supporting our Sitting Service and summer programme of activities for young carers.
