Sefton Carers Centre provides free advice and guidance for unpaid carers living in Sefton. Next week, their staff will be on hand to support carers in a number of ways from the Centre on South Road, Waterloo. Carers Week is a national awareness campaign to celebrate and recognise the vital contribution made up by the UK's 6.5 million unpaid carers. In Sefton, over 34,000 residents provide support to a family member or friend who could not manage without this help.

Anyone could be a carer, a 15-year-old looking after a parent with a long term health condition, a 40 year old caring for their partner who has terminal cancer or an 80 year old looking after their partner who has Alzheimer's disease.

During National Carers Week Sefton Council are supporting unpaid carers by providing free PPE packs which can be collected from Sefton Carers Centre in Waterloo from 7th of June to 11th June.

Covid 19 Vaccination for unpaid carers

The definition for carers entitled to the vaccination in this group is detailed below: Unpaid carers are classed in Priority Group 6 if they are in receipt of a carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer (those who are the sole or primary carer) of an elderly or disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill.

If the above criteria applies to you as a carer you can now register for the Covid-19 vaccination as follows:

1. You will need to contact your GP to register as an unpaid carer. They may ask for a copy

of this letter as evidence of registration with Sefton Carers Centre.

2. The GP will then be able to make arrangements for you to receive a vaccination.

If you are taking the person you care for to a vaccination appointment you may be able to receive yours at the same time, please discuss this with your GP prior to the appointment. Your GP practice is unlikely to be able to offer you an appointment at the time you contact them, you will be called as the practice works through its list of patients
