- Provide Parent Carers with a point of contact for information, advice and support relating to their caring role.
- Refer Parent Carers to in-house services.
- Signpost Parent Carers to appropriate services in Health, Social Care, Education and the VCF sector as appropriate.
- Offer low level advocacy to Parent Carers to support in accessing services.
- Support Parent Carers to have a voice in the development of services.
- Support Parent Carers in regard to future planning and transition to adult services.
- Identify and apply for external funding which will support the needs of Parent Carers.
- Run peer support groups for Parent Carers.
- Work with key organisations such as Parent Carer Forum.

Sefton PCF Sefton Parent Carer Forum

Sefton Parent Carer Forum are a small group of volunteers, our focus is for parents and carers of children and young people, aged 0-25 years, with special educational needs and or disabilities.

- o We provide information for parents and carers in Sefton
- o Through our network we are able to signpost families to a wide range of local opportunities.
- We work with Sefton Local Authority, Education settings, Cheshire and Merseyside ICB and NHS, social care, and other service providers to ensure that the services they plan and deliver meet the needs of children and young people, aged 0-25 years with SEND. We do this through consultation and co-production.
- When we are in contact with parents and carers, we are gathering their opinions.
 These opinions become part of a larger parent voice when we are are representing Sefton families. We gather this through our social media channels and from our coffee mornings.
- We run come and chat drop-in sessions with guest speakers, to bring the services and families together in an informal setting.
- We run weekly coffee mornings in Bootle for parent carers to come along and chat to those who get it, to access peer-topeer support.
- We are beginning fortnightly coffee mornings and come and chat sessions in Southport from September 18th.
- We run regular training sessions and workshops for parent carers and are always looking for more opportunities to do so.
- On November 22nd we are hosting Sefton's Local Offer Live, in partnership with Sefton's Services. This will be based in The Family Life Centre in Southport.
- We also host an annual pre-summer event, called Summer In Sefton, the aim of this is to give parent carers access, and information, to summer provision and activities.
